Cllr Butler- outlined the proposal to charge for green bin from April 2024 at a cost £57.00. Raised his concerns about the costs and that no consultation took place. Called into CNS.

1. Approvals/Refusals/Appeals- None

 New Applications- 23/00694/FUL- Retrospective Application for erection of 1no industrial building and siting of 9no. shipping containers in Class E (g)iii)) and B8 Uses.
The Barracks Piggery Milk And Water Drove Farcet Peterborough PE7 3DS

Cllr Cunnington conducted a site visit- no site management plan. No overall site management. Currently it seems there is only one porta-loo being shared. No health and welfare facilities on the drawing.

Access concerns, as access is onto a 60mph road, with limited visibility as a sharp bend before the entrance.

Cllr Gillam - the current buildings are bigger than the original piggeries- concerned that these are not building regulation compliant.

Hours of operation – no controls in place regarding the opening hours.

Concerns about environmental impact- spray paint that was used on the containers is on the surrounding ground.

Gravel surface- any spills, etc would seep in gravel and cause contamination.

Rubbish left outside, which could easily catch fire.

Cllr Cunnington was not opposed to the application if the appropriate conditions were put in place.

It was proposed by Cllr Gillam seconded by Cllr Howell agreed to recommend refusal based on the concerns raised above. Cllr Granger did not vote.

33/23-24 Cemetery & Allotments.

1. Application for interment of ashes

Clerk outlined the application for interment submitted to the Parish Council. It was proposed by Cllr Gillam seconded by Cllr Granger and agreed that we can offer the option of transfer ownership or a new plot for the ashes.

2. To discuss recent vehicular damage to graves and agree preventative actions

Cllr Gillam highlighted the damage that has taken place to two graves accessing the cemetery. It was suggested that two bollards adjacent to the graves to try and reduce the damage. Cllr Granger will donate the posts.

The Clerk will write to all the funeral directors to advise access via the chapel and the reason we have installed the bollards.

3. To advise council of future layout of cemetery grounds

Cllr Gillam highlighted the how the graves will be allocated moving forward.
